The countdown to summer fun has begun in the form of V.F.W. Camp Trotter! Young people have been enjoying the tradition of going to Camp Trotter since Ralph Trotter donated the property to the Department of Michigan Veterans of Foreign Wars in 1949. Ralph Trotter was a previous State Commander for the Department of Michigan VFW (1934–1935) and served in WWI. The Camp was originally called “VFW Buddy Poppy Camp”, and only had three buildings on the property. It was and still is the only VFW-owned and operated Camp in the United States. Many VFW and Auxiliary members have enjoyed the grounds and have helped shape Camp Trotter into what it is today. Their service continues to this day as we host yearly clean-up weekends, during which those members assist in preparing the Camp for summer. Camp Trotter’s success would not be possible without the help and support of the Michigan VFW and Auxiliary, and it is important to remember their service. Donations to the Camp to help with expenses can be sent to the VFW Department of Michigan in Lansing, marked “Camp Trotter General Fund”. You can also become a Lifetime member of Camp Trotter

with a \$50 Lifetime membership fee. Both forms and other information can be found on the website at [www.camptrrotter.org](http://www.camptrrotter.org). Camp operations run five weeks this summer for young people 7–12 years old (July 9–15; July 16–22; July 23–29; July 30–Aug 5; Aug. 6–12) at a cost of \$320 per camper. This includes an established realm of activities that will give the campers lifelong memories. Once again, you may visit the website listed above to see exactly what activities are planned for your camper. Maddy Schlossberg, VFW Camp Trotter Operations and Programs Director, invites you to attend Family Day at Camp Trotter on August 19, 2023. Come out and witness firsthand the beauty of Camp Trotter. Spend the day with your young person or just come to take a ride on Bills Lake on the Camp pontoon. Come remember what it’s like to have a good time in the outdoors and create more fond memories and better knowledge about nature, citizenship, and activities they find joy in. The Chairman of the Auxiliary Youth Activities Program will have a fun time this year promoting the programs for our young people. Through these programs we bring to school-age children and their leaders, we can promote veteran education and awareness. Here are just a few ways to get connected with Youth Activities:


