GREAT LAKES NATIONAL CEMETERY

Hello, for Fiscal Year 2024 for the Great Lakes National Cemetery, the following occurred. There were 4,400 internments between October 1st, 2023, through September 30th, 2024, bringing the total internments since opening in 2005 to 70,242. Flagpole maintenance is underway; this is the first time that all 100 poles will have maintenance and repairs done at once since the poles were installed. The poles have been repaired on an as-needed basis in the past. For the 19th

year, the Unaccompanied Ceremony was conducted in September, and 19 veterans received honors this year. Notable burials that recently occurred: Corporal Thomas Powers, a Medal of Honor recipient from the Indian Wars in Arizona, was interned on October 15th, 2024; he is the second Medal of Honor recipient to be interned at Great Lakes National Cemetery. Corporal Butler Martin, the last surviving member of the Montford Point Marines, was also interned on October 15th, 2024. Upcoming


event at the cemetery: Wreaths Across America will be December 14th, 2024. To close, I want to share a poem by Theodore O'hara that the Great Lakes National Cemetery posted on their Facebook page: Bivouac of the Dead "The muffled drum's sad roll has beat the soldier's last tattoo; no more on life's parade shall meet that brave and fallen few. On Fame's eternal camping-ground, their silent tents are spread, and glory guards, with solemn round, the bivouac of the dead."

A HERO HAS BEEN LAID TO REST WITH HONORS

On Tuesday, October 15th, 2024, Michigan veterans gathered at Great Lakes National Cemetery for the reinternment of Cpl. Thomas Powers, a Medal of Honor recipient from the Indian Wars in Arizona. Originally from New York, he had relocated to Detroit and eventually enlisted in the US Army on April 17th, 1867, at the age of 20. Assigned to Co. "G" of the 1st Calvary, he was assigned to the Arizona territory. In action against the Apache on October 20th, 1868, he performed above and beyond the call of duty and was awarded the Medal of Honor on March 8th, 1870, at Camp Bowie, AZ. Returning to Michigan, he married but died at a young age on December 2nd, 1884. His grave was marked by a large headstone that made no reference to his military service but spoke of his love of wife and family. His original burial place in Cummin Cemetery, Hazelton Township, Shiawassee County, was discovered in the fall of 2023. The cemetery is inactive and literally abandoned. Since that time Ray Johnston, Board Member of the Medal of Honor Historical Society, has been researching Cpl. Powers to learn of any surviving family members. None were found, and so began the application process of moving his remains to a place of honor, the Great Lakes National Cemetery. In September, permission was granted by the township and county to exhume any

potential remains. In a painstaking process, sufficient remains and other evidence were found to declare that the remains of Cpl. Thomas Powers were acquired. His remains were draped in the flag of our country, and he was removed to Nelson House Funeral Home in Owosso. An application for reburial at Great Lakes was made and ultimately granted. On October 15th, a detail of the US Army Funeral Honors Team performed the final services bestowed on all veterans, the final folding of the Flag under which he served, the volley of a final rifle salute, and the playing of Taps. And with that simple service, prayed over by the VFW Department Chaplain Terry Kunst, witnessed by honored veterans of the Patriot Guard, VFW Riders from Mt Pleasant, Midland, and District 4, VFW and Auxiliary members from Districts 4, 6, 9, 10, and 11, representatives of the American Legion and the DAV, and the Great Lakes Cemetery Honor Guard, and representatives of the Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency, Cpl. Thomas Powers was committed to the care of the Great Lakes VA National Cemetery. His burial flag was ceremoniously presented to John Ryder, Executive Director of Michigan Heroes Museum, Frankenmuth, where it will be permanently displayed together with his original grave marker, which has been relocated to the museum. We would

like to thank the many VFW Posts, DAV Chapters, and the American Legion, as well as many individuals who donated the funds necessary to make this happen and bring honor to a long-forgotten hero. We would like to thank MSG Adam Bacon, USAR Military Funeral Honors NCOIC, 88th Readiness Division, for his assistance above and beyond to ensure that final honors were performed in memory of Cpl. Thomas Powers, US Army. May he rest in peace in the care of his country and fellow veterans.

MENTAL HEALTH/VMS DIRECTOR, DOUG BRINKER

Comrades and Auxiliary of Mighty Michigan VFW, greetings from your Mental Health Wellness and VMS Team. We made it through another Fall Conference, and while I was not able to be at the table as I normally am, I hope you found some valuable resources there. With Mid-Winter approaching, I wanted to remind each Post, Auxiliary, and District that the team is available to request through Department website. For that, visit vfwmi.org/forms, then request a Department representative; please indicate dress attire if we are speaking and how long. I had the humbled honor to be a keynote speaker at Lenawee County Veterans Coalition's Inaugural Ruck, where I promoted the VFW and our Mental Health Team. And, on September 13th, I became THRIVE Certified, a suicide prevention program; THRIVE stands for Trusted relationships, High expectations, Resources, Involvement, Vision, and Enrichment. I hope to become a trainer in this model soon so that we can offer it throughout the Department. Next, I want to talk about All-State credit points and how they can be earned. 5 points for submitting

a Mental Health Awareness Advocate of the Year. 10 points for holding a mental health forum in your community (must include outreach resources with pictures of the event and at least one Certified Mental Health official submitted within 48 hours of the event). 5 points for donating your Post for a community mental health event. The Mental Health Team will host two panel discussions, and if a member of your Post volunteers as a panelist, your Post receives 5 points with a maximum of 15. 2 points for each member of your Post who attends a suicide prevention program training (ex. SAVE, QPR, SAFE TALK, ASSIST, etc.); the maximum is 10 points. 10 points for every Post hosting a VMS event biannually. 2 points per member attending a VMA-sponsored event that reports back to me. 5 points for purchasing a MAP pin and wearing it at District or Department events. 5 points to every Post submitting a bimonthly VMS report. 1 point for holding a VMS event or displaying VMS materials; maximum 5 points. 2 points to Adop-A-Unit and report which unit and what support is being given. 1 point for displaying VMS materials at your Post (picture evidence required); maximum 3 points. And finally, 1 point for each Post per District that completes requirements

for All-American by donating \$125 through the dashboard, not Department checks. We hope to be busy around the state at your Posts and community events for mental health wellness. We personally hope you found the presentation Dr. Kai gave was informative and helped in many ways. We will try to hold more of those and panels as well. A big focus is on military sexual trauma, where suicide rates are at an all-time high with reports of a 23% increase over the last 6 months. With the holidays upon us by the time this comes to you, it's crucial to ask your loved ones, "Are You OK?" times during holidays are most stressful on families. We have VMS pins available for \$20; they are gold, silver, and bronze kevlar (helmets). We have a very limited supply and will be selling them for Unmet Needs at Mid-Winter or District meetings. In closing, we must take care of each other, listening effectively to someone who states they don't feel safe or they're thinking of suicide. Please know the signs and know how to ask the ultimate question, "Are You Thinking of Suicide? If so, do you have a plan? These two life-saving questions are important to be willing to ask! On behalf of the team, we extend the happiest of holidays season to each of you and your families.

BIG 10 CONFERENCE

On October 18th-20th, 2024, the Department of Michigan VFW and Auxiliary Officers attended the Big Ten Conference Meeting in Indianapolis. On Friday evening, the delegates were entertained by country music star John Rich, who shared the story of his WWII grandfather in a song of tribute. It was a great evening! Big Ten Chairman James Nail (MO) chaired the VFW Conference meeting on Saturday. The delegates heard from all three of the National Officers: Commander-in-Chief Al Lipphardt, Sr. Vice Carol Whitmore, and Jr. Vice Tim Peters. Adjutant General Dan West was also present and gave a

great update on National Headquarters issues, including the very successful hurricane relief efforts in the southeast. The conference attendees received a presentation on parliamentary procedure, heard reports from each Department Commander, and received an update on the National Home from Executive Director Michael Wilson. The Big Ten Conference has several candidates running for Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief for 2026-27, and we heard briefly from two of them, Chris Haynes (OH) and Jim Nail (MO). The business meeting was concluded with the election of officers for the 2024-2025

year. Adam Wallace (WI) was elected as the VFW Big Ten Conference Chairman, Kurt Hermons (MN) was elected as Vice Chairman, Barry Walter (MI) was elected Secretary-Treasurer, and Debra Halter was elected Chaplain. Elected Officers were installed by Commander-in-Chief Al Lipphardt, with Asst. National Sgt. at Arms James Galen (MI) assisting. The Conference Meeting ended with the banquet on Saturday evening. National Auxiliary President Brenda Bryant and Commander-in-Chief Al Lipphardt both delivered their remarks to a full banquet room, concluding a very successful Big Ten Conference.

"This is VFW Post 3946's first donation to Senior Neighbors, and we are excited to help provide financial support for their home repair program, which helps veterans remain independent in their own homes," said Post Commander Larry Herrington. Ashley Doyle, administrator of the program, said the funds provided by the Post are greatly appreciated "and will be used to make needed repairs and modifications to the homes of Kent County veterans." Home repair assistance is individualized, based on the specific need of the veteran, and ranges from simple things such as installing grab bars in bathrooms and showers to more involved projects such as building handicap ramps and making minor home repairs. Suzanne Callahan, President of Senior Neighbors, said she "couldn't be more pleased with the donation," emphasizing "Senior Neighbors

is dedicated to helping all Kent County seniors, including veterans, live their lives with dignity, independence, and a sense of community." In addition to its Veterans' Home Repair Program, Senior Neighbors offers a wide range of other programs and services available not just to veterans but to any Kent County senior age 60 or over. The services the organization provides range from a pet program that helps seniors with veterinary bills and animal care items such as food to transportation, meals, and case management and crisis assistance. 


AUXILIARY DEPARTMENT MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN, MARIAN BELAIRE

If you get one, please send me a copy and report it. Support your local scouting organizations, and when you have them use your Post, report that, along with the cost of what it would be to rent it. Finally, every VFW Post is required to send a Post representative to each and every District meeting, or possibly face suspension of its charter.
